

**Year 6/key worker/vulnerable children school reopening**

8<sup>th</sup> June 2020

Dear parents and carers,

If you decide to send your child into school on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> June, we have set out guidance that you should read and follow carefully, to protect the health and safety of you, your child and of school staff.

Y6 has been split into two 'bubbles', 'bubble A' will be in the Y6 classroom and 'bubble B' will be the Y5 classroom. As per government guidance, there will be no more than 15 children per bubble. At school, your child will stay within their bubble. Social distancing and good hygiene will be encouraged and a stringent cleaning schedule will be in place following a whole school comprehensive risk assessment.

- Children can arrive at school through the gate near the front entrance between **9 - 9:30am**.
- Please ensure that only one adult accompanies your child to school.
- Please walk down the path adhering to the 2m tape.
- Children will be let in by a member of staff at a social distance of 2m.
- If there is more than one child waiting, please stick to the 2m tape guidelines.
- Maintain social distancing at all times and keep your child with you, they should not be allowed to play in the playground at this time.
- Your child should wear school uniform, we recommend changing out of uniform when they get home and have a clean uniform for the following day.
- Children are not required to bring anything other than a coat or packed lunch into school.
- They will be allocated a desk and individual resources for them to use throughout the day.
- Packed lunches will be stored within the classroom.
- If your child receives free school meals, a grab bag will be delivered to the classroom, and they will eat in the classroom within their bubble.
- If your child becomes ill they will be moved to a dedicated medical area.
- Home time collection will be from **2:45 - 3:15 pm**.
- Friday collection time **is 2:15pm**. School will then close for a deep clean.
- If your child repeatedly fails to be socially distant or deliberately acts in an unsanitary way, they may not be allowed back to school.
- If you need to talk to your class or bubble teacher, we ask that you please contact school by phone to arrange a phone meeting.
- You and your family should be following government guidelines for social distancing. Families who do not social distance in the community will pose a risk for staff and other pupils and therefore will not be able to take up their place in school at this time.

If you have not yet decided whether your child is returning to school on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> June, please contact school. We need 48 hours' notice to amend bubble sizes and arrange further staffing for this.

Please ensure that we have your up to date contact details so we can get in touch swiftly, if needed.
